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**BAIL SUPERVISION**

<b>Interventions suitable for</b>	Available to age 16+ following suitability assessment
<b>Programme Title and Provider</b>	<b>Bail supervision</b>
<b>Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available</b>	Bail supervision helps minimise the numbers of individuals held on remand in custody pending trial or for reports after conviction who, subject to safeguards in respect of public protection, could be released on bail to the community pending their further court hearing.
<b>Possible Outcomes</b>	If the accused has unresolved trauma issues or other complex needs, then Bail Supervision provides an important early intervention opportunity to address needs and maintain compliance with bail conditions.
<b>Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention</b>	Available to age 16+ following suitability assessment

This service seeks to build on the routine, structure and learned work skills as transferrable employability attributes to create a safe and suitable pathway to employment. Unpaid work also has an important restorative contribution

There is a greater emphasis on drugs treatment, rather than a specific offence-focused approach, as the primary means of reducing offending and promoting social inclusion.
Possible Outcomes	Reduction or elimination of dependency or propensity to misuse drugs and reduce the scale and frequency of drug related offending
