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BAIL SUPERVISION

Interventions suitable for	As imposed by Court
Programme Title and Provider	Bail supervision Provided by Ayrshire Partnership Delivery Team
Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	Bail supervision schemes are designed to minimise the numbers of accused held on remand in custody pending trial or for reports after conviction, who subject to safeguards in respect of public safety, could be released on bail to the community pending their further court hearing (SG 2008). Male and Female, age 16+ who are at risk of remand to custody. Contact is initially three times per week consisting of two office based and one home visit.
Possible Outcomes	Reduce remand to custody and address health / addiction needs via referrals to community based services.
Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention	Risk and suitability assessment completed by Justice Officers / Social Workers at Court

Programme Title and Provider	Caledonian System
Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	In accordance with Caledonian Programme Manual a full assessment is carried out at CJSWR stage. Pre-programme and Case Management carried out by appropriately trained Social Worker within the Justice Team. Groupwork component is carried out by Partnership Delivery Team.
Possible Outcomes	The Caledonian System is an integrated approach to address men's domestic abuse and to improve the lives of women, children and men. It does this by working with men convicted of domestic abuse related offences on a programme to reduce their re-offending while offering integrated services to women and children. The Caledonian model takes the form of an intervention system comprising: the men's programme, women's service and children's service. The men's programme uses a person-centred approach coupled with cognitive behavioural techniques in order to encourage men to recognise their abuse and take responsibility for themselves and their relationship with the ex/partners and children. It is aimed at adult men, defined as over 16 years, whose

	abuse has been to a female partner or ex-partner. Men can be referred by the Court to this two year programme if they have been convicted of offences involving domestic abuse. The programme is statutory and men are required to attend.

Possible Outcomes	<p>MFMC - The Moving Forward: Making Changes Programme has been designed by the Scottish Prison Service and The Community Justice Operational Practice Unit of the Scottish Government, in order to deliver best practice in Sex Offender treatment in Scotland. The programme is based on recent advances in research and practice, and from experiential learning gained from delivering programmes throughout the prison and † justice social work environments. At present people who are made subject to a custodial sentence are no longer able to participate in MFMC in custody. This now has an impact on individuals not being able to start the intervention whilst in custody and continue with same programme on their release to the community.</p> <p>It is based upon the dynamic risk factors identified through the Stable 2007 risk assessment and matches levels of intervention to levels of risk and need and assists participants to lead a satisfying life that does not involve harming others.</p> <p>Moving Forward: Making Changes is targeted at men aged 18 upward and it is anticipated that a period of up to 3 years will be required to fully complete the programme.</p> <p>The individual will complete a schedule of individual pre-group work with their case manager, followed by a period of assignment based group-work with other individuals, delivered by accredited facilitators. This is</p>

	then followed by a further period of supplementary/maintenance work with the case manager.

COMMUNITY PAYBACK ORDER: TREATMENT: MENTAL HEALTH

Interventions suitable for	For a mental health treatment requirement to be imposed under a CPO, the court has to be satisfied, following evidence from a registered medical practitioner, that: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the individual suffers from a mental health condition; • the condition requires and may be susceptible to treatment; and • that the condition is not such as to require compulsory treatment under section 64 of the 2003 Act or a compulsion order under section 57A of the 1995 Act. The person must agree to the mental health treatment requirement otherwise the requirement cannot be made.
Programme Title and Provider	Treatment: mental health The purpose of imposing a mental health treatment requirement is to ensure that an individual who has been diagnosed with a mental health condition and/or learning disability which contributes to the person's offending receives support, care and treatment to enable them to improve their mental health in terms of their mental health needs. Resilience in Stressful Events (RISE), Ayrshire wide community service which will address the common mental health needs such as anxiety and depression for individuals who have come into contact with Justice Services
Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	As per National Outcomes and Standards A mental health treatment requirement is imposed to enable the individual to access assessment and treatment by or under the direction of a registered medical practitioner or registered psychologist with a view to the improvement of the individual's mental health. This treatment will be determined by the opinion of a registered medical practitioner or registered psychologist and should be recorded and updated in the case management plan.
Possible Outcomes	The person may receive treatment as an outpatient, day patient or in patient (not secure care). A referral to the appropriate community care social work service should be considered where it is assessed there may be ongoing support needs, once a compulsory treatment order and CPO

	are no longer in force. It is good practice for the community care social work service to undertake an assessment to determine needs and services which can be offered to help provide support.

COMMUNITY PAYBACK ORDER: TREATMENT: ALCOHOL

<p>Interventions suitable for</p>	<p>Where a person's dependence on alcohol contributes to the offending behaviour. Legislation states that the court must be satisfied that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the person is dependent on alcohol; • the dependency requires, and may be susceptible to, treatment; • arrangements have, or can be made, for the proposed treatment to take place including where treatment is to be residential, and details of such arrangements. <p>The court is likely also to want to be satisfied that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the requirement is appropriate for the individual; • the individual is motivated to comply with the requirement and engage in treatment; • that the work undertaken is focused on reducing or eliminating alcohol dependency; • that alcohol is a significant factor in the individual's life, causing impaired general functioning e.g. impacting on health, relationships, employment and contributing to their offending behaviour.

<p>Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available</p>	<p>As per National Outcomes and Standards and with input from NHS Addiction Services/Ayrshire Council on Alcohol</p> <p>Rapid Access to Drug and Alcohol Recovery (RADAR). This service provides rapid access to support and or treatment for anyone affected by drugs or alcohol in the East Ayrshire area. A partnership approach from NHS Addiction Services, We Are With You, Ayrshire Council on Alcohol and East Ayrshire Advocacy Service. The service aims to offer a same day or next day appointment to help you identify the recovery support best suited to individual needs.</p>
<p>Possible Outcomes</p>	<p>The aim of the alcohol treatment requirement should be recovery from alcohol dependency. Where a CPO including an alcohol treatment requirement is imposed, a case management plan will require to be compiled by the responsible officer which should indicate what treatment and interventions the individual will receive to address their alcohol dependency. It should also ensure that individuals are well supported to participate in treatment and follow up on goals they have set as a result of it.</p>

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DRUG TREATMENT AND TESTING ORDER (DTTO)

Interventions suitable for	The purpose of a DTTO is to focus on individuals for whom offending is a consequence of substance misuse (for example, acquisitive offending to support dependence), and who are at direct risk of receiving a custodial sentence.
Programme Title and Provider	Drug Treatment and Testing Order (DTTO)
Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	Statutory Order for individuals who have direct correlation between drug dependency and offending behaviour. DTTO in Ayrshire have a specialised team consisting of Supervising Officers and Addiction Workers who work in partnership with NHS Addiction Services to provide treatment (both pharmacological and psychosocial) to facilitate change in behaviour and lifestyle. A recovery focused, person-centred approach is adopted to meet individual need. DTTO can be imposed for a duration of six months to three years depending upon presenting need at DTTO assessment stage. DTTO is considered to be direct alternative to custody and is considered for individuals who have exhausted every other Court disposal.
Possible Outcomes	To break the cycle of drug dependency and offending behaviour through providing a person centred approach to treatment. Outcomes are measured subjectively by the Service User on a three monthly basis utilising 9 areas of recovery; including relationships, self-care and nutrition; physical and mental health, drug use and offending behaviour. It is hoped that through the duration of the DTTO that scores within these axes will increase, with any decreases highlighting areas of support/addiction need.
Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention	At the CJSWR report writing stage a screening is undertaken to establish whether or not the individual meets the criteria. If the criteria is met then a request is made to the Court to defer sentence for a period of four weeks to allow DTTO staff to undertake a full assessment of suitability. The DTTO assessment is undertaken by the Supervising Officer to establish whether the individual is a 'suitable' person with motivation to change their lifestyle. Gaps in offending behaviour are explored and areas of recovery capital and resilience identified to determine a starting point for treatment/interventions. DTTOs are reviewed by the Sentencer initially on a monthly basis and this process is undertaken within a closed Court to allow for direct dialogue between the sentencer and the service user. Interventions utilised by the team vary depending upon need. In the early stages a full care plan will be developed in collaboration with the service user and appropriate interventions will be employed to ensure that all areas of need are met. Motivational Interviewing is utilised in the early stages of a DTTO to encourage ambivalent individuals to consider areas of change.

STRUCTURED DEFERRED SENTENCE

Interventions suitable for	Anyone over age of 18 years
Programme Title and Provider	Structured Deferred Sentence
Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	SDS is targeted at individuals who have a low to medium risk/needs rating (LSCMi) with regards to reoffending. This disposal targets individuals who have an identifiable need which could be explored and addressed through a six month intervention. All types of low level offending behaviour will be considered.
Possible Outcomes	A reduction in the risk of reoffending behaviour. When an SDS is imposed staff measure 5 areas of change which is revisited when the disposal nears its end. This is a subjective tool which measures areas of offending behaviour, substance misuse, connections, health and lifestyle.
Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention	At the CJSWR report writing stage a screening is undertaken to establish whether or not the individual meets the criteria. If the criteria is met then an action plan is established at this time and outlined within this section of the report. If the intervention is imposed a report will be submitted to Court after three months and a completion report after six months. Interventions are identified and delivered by staff on a bespoke basis as identified need at the screening stage can change considerably following the formation of a positive relationship with named worker.
