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BAIL SUPERVISION

Interventions suitable for	Anyone
Programme Title and Provider	Bail Supervision
Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	Bail support is Facilitated by dedicated CJSW staff
Possible Outcomes	Support will include addiction, housing, debt, employment/training and educational opportunities, and so outcomes will include improvements in these areas.
Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention	Information is gathered and verified to through an assessment process, providing a brief report for the Sheriff, PF and defence agent to assist the Court in reaching a decision to grant bail.

COMMUNITY PAYBACK ORDER: UNPAID WORK

Interventions suitable for	Anyone
Programme Title and Provider	Unpaid Work
Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	Sacro, CJSW, and individual personal placements with charitable organisations across the city
Possible Outcomes	Completion of unpaid work hours, new skills gained, access to training/ volunteering/ employability. Additionally, signposting on to other relevant universal services and corresponding improvements in wellbeing and other spheres. Improvements for the community, and for individuals who submit requests for unpaid work.
Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention	At the point of order (where appropriate) placements can be fast-tracked and begin work placement within 24 hours. Otherwise, further assessment can take place to ensure the most appropriate placement, including personal placements to suit individual need.

Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	There is the opportunity to engage in a broad range of justice specific and more generic support services, tailored to individual need, facilitated by CJSW staff.

Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention	Recommendation at court report stage.

Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	Facilitated by CJSW staff
Possible Outcomes	Reduction in drug use, stabilisation, reduced reoffending and Improved overall health and wellbeing. Improved housing and welfare outcomes, improved relationships with family and community. Resultant impact on community.
Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention	Recommendation at court report stage

STRUCTURED DEFERRED SENTENCE

Programme Title and Provider	Structured Deferred Sentence
Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	Facilitated by CJSW staff
Possible Outcomes	Reduced likelihood of custody and associated disruption, maintain housing, employment, family relationships and income, less disruption to community, improved wellbeing, reduced reconviction.
Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention	Recommendation by CJSW or lawyer. SDS should be considered as part of CJSWR.

THIRD SECTOR PROGRAMMES

Interventions suitable for	Women
Programme Title and Provider	218, Turning Point Scotland
Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	Provides an alternative to custody for women aged 18 and over who have live criminal justice involvement in the last 12 months. It comprises a 12-place residential service. The service includes therapeutic staff and Mental health and general nurses, in-house psychologist, and visiting specialist medical care. There is an evidence based, intensive group work programme, and stabilisation and detoxification is also available where assessed appropriate.
Possible Outcomes	Improved outcomes in all areas of health and wellbeing and personal safety are expected, leading to reduced offending and substance use and improved housing, family relationships, housing and welfare outcomes. Aftercare is also part of the programme to support sustained outcomes.
Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention	Referrals can be made by Sheriffs, CJSW, Drug court, Addictions SW, Diversion any other relevant agency, self referral and there is a court assessment team in Glasgow Sheriff Court. This option can be considered as part of bail conditions.
Relevant information re. funding for the programme	Service wholly funded, individual funding not required.

Interventions suitable for	All subject to probation, CJSW supervision or CPO
Programme Title and Provider	Community Justice First Glasgow Council on Alcohol
Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	A group work programme suitable for those currently on probation, on CPO or supervised as part of through care services. It covers a range of issues and is designed to enable participants to make positive lifestyle changes.
Possible Outcomes	Promote life skills, facilitate change, reduce alcohol use and increase alcohol knowledge, improve problem-solving skills and set life goals.
Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention	Referral by CJSW for those on probation, CPO or supervision, and the service assess.
Relevant information re. funding for the programme	Service wholly funded, individual funding not required.

Interventions suitable for	Men with prison sentences under 4 years
Programme Title and Provider	New Routes, PSP with the Wise Group being the Lead provider
Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	Available to men sentenced to less than 4 years in prison, New Routes is a PSP working with men before they are released from prison, and for a number of weeks after to help prisoners acquire the life, social and employment skills they need to re-join society. The project employ Life Coaches, many of whom themselves have a background of offending or recovery from addiction, who then use their own experience in turning their life around to help others.
Possible Outcomes	Improved accommodation, welfare, employability, family relationship and overall wellbeing outcomes, reduced reoffending
Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention	Referral via SPS or link centre in prisons
Relevant information re. funding for the programme	Now available to all sentenced men following expansion of criteria in 2019. Funding only assured until 30/06/2020

Interventions suitable for	All women serving a short sentence, on remand or CPO
Programme Title and Provider	SHINE, PSP with the SACRO being the Lead provider
Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	The service is available to all adult females who are: currently serving a custodial sentence in Scotland of less than four years and not subject to a statutory order or; on remand or; subject to a Community Payback Order
Possible Outcomes	Improved accommodation, welfare, employability, positive use of time, community reintegration, reduced risk of breaching CPO, family relationship and overall wellbeing outcomes, reduced reoffending

Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention	referrals can be self referral, from prison staff, via SHINE staff in prison and community referrals from SWS
Relevant information re. funding for the programme	Funding only assured until 31/03/22

Interventions suitable for	All where offending is related to drug use
Programme Title and Provider	Drug Court
Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	Multidisciplinary team enabling intensive assessment and supervision to reduce drug dependency and related offending behaviour
Possible Outcomes	Rapid access to treatment, stabilisation and reduction of illicit substance use, reduction in reoffending. Other outcomes are also achieved in order to meet individual needs and create stability.
Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention	There are dedicated Sheriffs who have jurisdiction over the community based treatment orders made in the Drug Court, and good knowledge of the interventions and successes.

Interventions suitable for	All where offending is related to alcohol use
Programme Title and Provider	Alcohol Court
Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	A problem-solving court approach
Possible Outcomes	A reduction in alcohol use and reoffending, and support to achieve stability, ensuring the conditions to avoid future offending
Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention	A dedicated Sheriff has jurisdiction and knowledge of the successes of the drug court upon which the model is based.

Interventions suitable for	All up to age 21
Programme Title and Provider	Youth Court

Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	A problem-solving court approach to summary cases for people aged up to 21 at time of offence, or 25 where concerns are noted.
Possible Outcomes	Early intervention to reduce future reoffending, providing support in all areas identified through assessment, addressing any underlying issues which may have had lead to offending.
Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention	All criminal justice social work reports for young people 21 and under, consider the youth court as a sentencing option.

Programme Title and Provider	Positive Outcomes Project
Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	A partnership with SW addictions, Police Scotland, recovery co-ordinator taking an effective and assertive outreach approach to work with the individuals who are involved in persistent offending and alcohol and/or drug use.
Possible Outcomes	Reduced offending and substance use, improved housing, welfare, health and wellbeing outcomes, improved relationships and wider community benefits
Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention	Individuals are identified vis police and social work data systems and the team approach them the support they need to change offending behaviour.
