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BAIL SUPERVISION

Interventions suitable for	People at risk of being remanded
Programme Title and Provider	Bail supervision
Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	There is a local Bail Supervision scheme in operation across Moray, delivered by Criminal Justice Social Work, in conjunction with partners as appropriate. Bail supervision is also provided for people subject to electronic monitoring whilst on bail.
Possible Outcomes	Bail supervision provides a robust alternative to remand for individuals who are assessed as needing supervision and support to meet their bail conditions
Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention	Assessment by Criminal Justice Social Worker in conjunction with Procurator Fiscal. A written report is submitted to the Court by Criminal Justice Social Work

COMMUNITY PAYBACK ORDER: UNPAID WORK

Interventions suitable for	People who have committed offences
Programme Title and Provider	Unpaid work
Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	<p>Unpaid Work is managed by Criminal Justice Social Work. In addition to generic work squads which undertake a range of tasks, there are 'female only', 'short' (light duties) squads and individual work placements at different organisations and locations across Moray.</p> <p>Unpaid work orders can be complemented by 'other activities'. Up to 30% of an unpaid work requirement (or 30 hours, whichever is the lower) can consist of activity other than unpaid work. Criminal Justice Social Work will determine the nature and extent (if any) of the 'other activity' element</p>
Possible Outcomes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Community safety and public protection • Reduced offending • Social inclusion to support desistance from offending • 'Other activities' can include training and coaching that can lead to improved employment prospects

Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	Programme for men convicted of domestic abuse offences to help them recognise their abuse, take responsibility for it and reduce likelihood of reoffending. It is delivered on a 1:1 basis

Programme Title and Provider	Drug Treatment and Testing Order (DTTO)
Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	Assessment, testing and supervision is undertaken by Criminal Justice Social Work
Possible Outcomes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Eliminate or reduce an individual's propensity to misuse drugs • Achieve positive changes in the scale and frequency of drug-related offending
Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention	Assessment of suitability undertaken by Criminal Justice Social Work, in conjunction with relevant partners

Interventions suitable for	Women in or on the periphery of the Criminal Justice system
Programme Title and Provider	SHINE
Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	Shine is a women's mentoring service for women in or on the periphery of the Criminal Justice system. Support is provided to women in all manners of life, with an emphasis on resettlement and independent living within communities.
Possible Outcomes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Community safety and public protection • Reduced offending • Social inclusion to support desistance from offending
Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention	Available to women aged 16+ who are <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Remanded in custody • Serving sentences of 4 years or less • Subject of a Community Payback Order and at risk of breach – with this criteria in other local authority areas rather than the women being referred back to the courts for a breach they would be linked to Shine for some work. Shine Mentors' role would be to get the women to re-engage with Criminal Justice Social Work • Includes Schedule 1 offenders.

Interventions suitable for	Individuals who have served in the UK's military services and have committed offences
Programme Title and Provider	Veterans' Mentoring Service (VMS)
Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	The Veteran's Mentoring Service is available to those who have a minimum of one day's service in the military and are in or on the periphery of the Criminal Justice system.
Possible Outcomes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Community safety and public protection • Reduced offending • Social inclusion to support desistance from offending
Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention	Available to veterans of all armed forces <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Involved in or on the periphery of offending behaviour • In or out of custody • All Mentors will have lived military experienced (this could be either self/spouse, etc.) • Includes Schedule 1 offenders
