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BAIL SUPERVISION

Interventions suitable for	All East Lothian residents where sentencers are considering a period of remand.
Programme Title and Provider	Justice Social Work (East Lothian and Edinburgh)
Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	East Lothian Justice Social Work has a Bail Supervision pathway for all of these aged 18 and over. It is for the Court Social Work Unit in the sentencing Court to complete the assessment on behalf of East Lothian – there is no Court in East Lothian following the closure of Haddington on 1 February 2015. There is a current partnership with the Social Work Unit at Edinburgh Sheriff Court.
Possible Outcomes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reduction in remand • Equality of access to services • Intensive supervisory oversight – behaviour management
Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention	Assessment at Court on request of Sheriff, JP or Judge – report and initial action plan development with same day turnaround.

COMMUNITY PAYBACK ORDER: UNPAID WORK

Interventions suitable for	All appropriate service users - no restrictions
Programme Title and Provider	Community Payback Work Team (Justice Social Work Service)
Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	The Community Payback Work Team in East Lothian provide individual placements for those unable to undertake a work group, primarily within charity shops and other volunteering opportunities including the Ridge project. The work groups provide various opportunities to benefit all local communities throughout East Lothian. For example, The Community Payback Work Team have worked in partnership with tenancy support schemes to clear and upgrade gardens for residents with mental health issues. There are regular seasonal groundwork projects at Belhaven Hospital and Cockenzie House, and where possible those subject to unpaid work hours support the Rangers service at Yellowcraig. Further details can be provide if required.

Individuals who are assessed as presenting a serious risk of causing harm and may suffer from a Personality Disorder can be referred to the Serious Offender Liaison Service at the Royal Edinburgh Hospital.
Possible Outcomes	As required to manage mental health challenges and reintegrate back into local communities.

Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	NHS Lothian 'Lothian and Edinburgh Abstinence Programme – LEAP': a day programme for people dependent on substances who want to get clean and sober. If alcohol is part of a wider drugs problem LEAP will also offer treatment. Lasts three months and involves structured activities every day. Is for people living in Edinburgh and the Lothian's.

Interventions suitable for	All those with convictions whose offence is directly related to drug use
Programme Title and Provider	Drug Treatment and Testing Order (Justice Services - Edinburgh)
Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	These orders are imposed on East Lothian individuals and managed by Partners in City of Edinburgh Council Justice Services.
Possible Outcomes	As per Drug Testing and Treatment Order National Guidelines
Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention	Criminal Justice Social Work Report + Drug Testing and Treatment Order Assessment

STRUCTURED DEFERRED SENTENCE

Interventions suitable for	Young people up to the age of 18
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Programme Title and Provider	Youth Justice Service (East Lothian)
Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	Youth Justice Service can provide an individual, needs-led service now and when group work started this group would also be considered for that intervention.
Possible Outcomes	Support desistance and community reintegration.
Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention	Social Work may make a preference for a deferred sentence because a care plan/support package is already in place, as part of another order.

Interventions suitable for	Military Veterans (UK military (Royal Navy, Army , Royal Air Force))
Programme Title and Provider	Veterans Mentoring Service; SACRO
Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available	Sacro's Veterans Mentoring Service is a service for military veterans who are currently in or are at risk of becoming involved in the criminal justice system. The aim of the service is to enable the service user to enjoy sustainable, independent living.
Possible Outcomes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Address alcohol and drug addictions • Address physical and mental health issues with assistance of partnership agencies • Access support services in your local area • Keep appointments with other agencies • Enhance life and social skills, e.g. financial budgeting, housekeeping, cooking • Complete paperwork and make phone calls • Reintegrate into the community • Access education or training • Find employment opportunities.
Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention	Self-referral or via social work, Scottish Prison Service, a voluntary organisation or any stakeholder working with veterans. Once the referral is accepted by all parties, the veteran will be requested to attend for an assessment. During this assessment, an action plan will be devised taking into consideration all aspirations and wishes of the veteran. It is expected that the engagement with the paid mentor will be somewhere

	<p>between 6-12 months, during which time all points raised in the action plan will be addressed.</p> <p>Exit Phase: Once the engagement with the paid mentor has ceased, the veteran will be matched to a volunteer mentor to continue with planned support for a further 4-6 months. During this phase, it will be expected that coping strategies, problem solving skills and natural supports will be sufficiently in place to allow the veteran to exit the service with any prior appropriate onward referrals being made.</p>
