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## BAIL SUPERVISION

<b>Interventions suitable for</b>	Available for all offence types for East Renfrewshire service users. Male and female aged 16 +
<b>Programme Title and Provider</b>	<b>Bail supervision</b>
<b>Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available</b>	Bail supervision is intended to provide a robust and credible alternative to remand where individuals are assessed as needing a level of supervision and support to meet their bail conditions. Bail Supervision is a social work or third sector service whereby individuals who would otherwise be held on remand are released on bail on the condition that they meet with a bail supervisor a specified number of times a week.
<b>Possible Outcomes</b>	To: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• reduce the number of individuals remanded to custody</li> <li>• encourage greater confidence in the use of non-custodial disposals by sentencers as a result of the experience of successful completion of periods on bail supervision</li> </ul> Provide appropriate support to individuals in the community, which minimises disruption to families, employment and housing, while ensuring compliance with bail conditions.
<b>Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention</b>	Criminal Justice Social Work, in collaboration with partners involved in a case as appropriate, should identify individuals, who might otherwise be remanded to custody but based on assessed need and risk can with the support of bail supervision, be safely released on bail.
<b>Where no specific scheme/intervention is available, is there capacity to provide a bespoke service based on judicial request? Please provide details</b>	No specific scheme /intervention is available at present. We are currently exploring this option with other authorities.

**COMMUNITY PAYBACK ORDER: UNPAID WORK**

<b>Interventions suitable for</b>	Available for all offence types for East Renfrewshire service users. Male and female aged 16 +
<b>Programme Title and Provider</b>	<b>Unpaid work</b>
<b>Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available</b>	Through use of other activity hours, people undertaking a Community Payback Orders Unpaid work requirement can be credited for hours if they undertake the following activities: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Engagement with Employability/Training Services</li> <li>• Engagement with Adult Learning ( No Barriers Service)</li> </ul>
<b>Possible Outcomes</b>	Community reparation, addressing range of criminogenic needs through other activity i.e. addictions/mental health/employability. Specific groups for light duties/women with chronic issues/sexual offenders or those at risk.

<b>Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention</b>	Level 1 standalone order - no assessment required, otherwise assessment re-suitability will be within Criminal Justice Social Work Reports.
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### COMMUNITY PAYBACK ORDER: SUPERVISION

<b>Interventions suitable for</b>	Available for all offence types for East Renfrewshire service users. Male and female aged 16 +
<b>Programme Title and Provider</b>	<b>Supervision</b>
<b>Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available</b>	The person will be supervised by an allocated Justice Social Worker. Levels of supervision will reflect the intensity of input required to manage and address the issues associated with an individual's offending.
<b>Possible Outcomes</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Reduced offending behavior</li> <li>• Referrals to appropriate agencies such as Housing, Addictions, Money Advice</li> </ul>
<b>Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention</b>	<p>Assessed for suitability by the Criminal Justice Social Worker when completing the Criminal Justice Social Work Report for the court. An initial analysis of the individual's offending – which considers the pattern, nature, seriousness, and likelihood of offending – will have been carried out at the Criminal Justice Social Work Report stage.</p> <p>A fuller risk/needs assessment and analysis of the individual's offending will be required in every case where an offender supervision requirement has been imposed, whether the requirement was informed by a Criminal Justice Social Work Report or not.</p> <p>This fuller assessment, informed by an agreed method or tool such as LS/CMI (Level of Service Case Management Inventory) should be completed within 4 weeks of the requirement being imposed. This assessment should be used to determine the main elements of the case management plan, including the level of supervision necessary to support rehabilitation. Supervision levels should be considered as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Low intensity</li> <li>• Very high intensity</li> <li>• High intensity</li> <li>• Medium intensity</li> </ul>

### COMMUNITY PAYBACK ORDER: PROGRAMME

<b>Interventions suitable for</b>	Men aged 18+ where convicted of sexual offences
<b>Programme Title and Provider</b>	<b>Moving Forward Making Changes</b>
<b>Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available</b>	Available for East Renfrewshire service users, men 18+ where convicted of sexual offences and assessed as appropriate on the basis of specialist risk assessments.

	Moving Forward Making Changes (MFMC) MFMC is rooted in the 'Good Lives Model' (GLM) for offender rehabilitation. The Good Lives model assumes that everyone wants certain primary goods in their life but that, for offenders, this desire manifests itself in harmful ways due to a range of deficits in the offender and/or their environment. It is designed to be delivered in a group format, although it can also be delivered 1:1 or 2:1. It is based on 'rolling groups' – men join the group at different times and can be at different stages of the programme at the same time.
<b>Possible Outcomes</b>	Assists participants to recognise and stop using sexual behaviours and to lead a satisfying life, which does not involve harm to others. It will also help participants to: reduce offending; increase self-confidence and self-esteem; improve relationships, and identify positive goals and the steps to achieve them
<b>Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention</b>	Where a man has been convicted of a sexual offence and the Court defers sentence for Criminal Justice Social Work Reports, eligibility for the programme will be assessed and included in the report based on age, patterns of offending and risk. If made subject to a programme requirement by the court, the man will undertake a period of pre programme work before moving onto completing identified Moving Forward Making Changes modules that meet his treatment need.

### COMMUNITY PAYBACK ORDER: TREATMENT: MENTAL HEALTH

<b>Interventions suitable for</b>	Available for all offence types for East Renfrewshire service users. Male and female 16 +
<b>Programme Title and Provider</b>	<b>Treatment: mental health</b>
<b>Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available</b>	The purpose of imposing a mental health treatment requirement is to ensure that an individual who has been diagnosed with a mental health condition and/or learning disability which contributes to the individual's offending receives support, care and treatment to enable them to improve their mental health in terms of their mental health needs. People who are made subject to such a requirement will be supported by East Renfrewshire Council Mental Health Team.
<b>Possible Outcomes</b>	This serves to aid compliance with the Order and promote the welfare of the person, whilst addressing their Mental Health and wellbeing issues
<b>Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention</b>	Assessment re-suitability will be within Criminal Justice Social Work Reports on the basis of mental health assessment as to appropriateness for intervention and planned service provision.

### COMMUNITY PAYBACK ORDER: TREATMENT: DRUGS

<b>Interventions suitable for</b>	Available for all offence types for East Renfrewshire service users. Male and female 16 +
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<b>Programme Title and Provider</b>	<b>Treatment: drugs</b>
<b>Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available</b>	This serves to aid compliance with the Order and promote the welfare of the client The aim of all treatment should be recovery from drug use
<b>Possible Outcomes</b>	A drug treatment requirement might be imposed when there are drug issues identified, but where an individual has not established a chronic history of drug misuse. Such a requirement will only be imposed in addition to an offender supervision requirement. Individuals with drug problems, who would not be eligible for a Drug Treatment or Testing Order, because their offending history is not sufficiently high tariff, should be considered by the Criminal Justice Social Work Reports author for such a disposal. This may include, for example, females who generally have a lower tariff offending history or some first time offenders.
<b>Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention</b>	Assessment re-suitability will be within Criminal Justice Social Work Reports on the basis of a Community Addiction Service assessment as to appropriateness for intervention and planned service provision.

### COMMUNITY PAYBACK ORDER: TREATMENT: ALCOHOL

<b>Interventions suitable for</b>	Available for all offence types for East Renfrewshire service users. Male and female aged 16+.
<b>Programme Title and Provider</b>	<b>Treatment: alcohol</b>
<b>Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available</b>	This serves to aid compliance with the Community payback Order and promote the welfare of the client. Addressing an individual's alcohol dependence can therefore help address offending behaviour as well as wider personal and social needs.
<b>Possible Outcomes</b>	Reduced offending Referral to rehabilitation services Improved physical and mental well being
<b>Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention</b>	Assessment re-suitability will be within Criminal Justice Social Work Reports on the basis of addiction service assessment as to appropriateness for intervention and planned service provision.

### DRUG TREATMENT AND TESTING ORDER (DTTO)

<b>Interventions suitable for</b>	Available for all offence types for East Renfrewshire service users.
<b>Programme Title and Provider</b>	<b>Drug Treatment and Testing Order (DTTO)</b>
<b>Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available</b>	A Drug Treatment and Testing Order is a high tariff disposal for individuals with drug problems who might otherwise receive a custodial sentence.
<b>Possible Outcomes</b>	Managing/addressing significant addiction issues related to offending.

<b>Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention</b>	Assessment re-suitability will be within Criminal Justice Social Work Reports. The purpose of a Drug Treatment and Testing Order is to target individuals whose offending is a direct result of their drug misuse, for example, those who steal to fund their habit and who are at direct risk of a custodial sentence.
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**STRUCTURED DEFERRED SENTENCE**

<b>Interventions suitable for</b>	Men and Women aged 16+ appearing at court.
<b>Programme Title and Provider</b>	<b>Structured Deferred Sentence (SDS)</b>
<b>Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available</b>	A Structured Deferred Sentence aims to provide a structured intervention for individuals upon conviction and prior to final sentencing. In East Renfrewshire SDS is low to medium tariff, aimed at: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Young people aged 16-26</li> <li>• Woman offenders</li> <li>• People who are motivated to engage with a short structured intervention</li> </ul>
<b>Possible Outcomes</b>	Prevent individuals being further drawn into the justice system. Meeting assessed criminogenic and non-criminogenic needs and building an individual's motivation and capacity for positive change; reducing the frequency or seriousness of offending behaviour; and avoiding premature or unnecessarily intensive periods of supervision in the community.
<b>Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention</b>	Assessment of suitability will take place at Criminal Justice Social Work Reports writing

**THIRD SECTOR PROGRAMMES**

<b>Interventions suitable for</b>	Male service users with chronic issues/lifestyle collapse
<b>Programme Title and Provider</b>	<b>Turnaround residential service; Turning Point Scotland</b>
<b>Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available</b>	Turnaround residential service for male service users with chronic issues/lifestyle collapse.
<b>Possible Outcomes</b>	Stabilisation, Detox. Support following period of rehabilitation
<b>Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention</b>	Referral by CJSW. Note a place requires to be available for an individual subject to a Community Payback Order. This process is undertaken in partnership with the CJSW and addiction worker involved in the case. A

	review is held at the half way stage of the residential period. This allows time for the planning and is an opportunity to have an action plan in place to support the individual's return to the community.
<b>Relevant information re. funding for the programme</b>	Funded directly from government from S10 funding. Not available to all local authorities nationally.

<b>Interventions suitable for</b>	Open to anyone on a community payback order.
<b>Programme Title and Provider</b>	<b>New Routes; Wise Group</b>
<b>Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available</b>	Specialist one-to-one support through, Peer Mentoring service, bail supervision
<b>Possible Outcomes</b>	To support individuals on Orders to develop their independence and social skills, link to appropriate services, explore aspirations, identify goals and put in place achievable steps to improve their quality of life.
<b>Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention</b>	Open to anyone on a community payback order.
<b>Relevant information re. funding for the programme</b>	Funded by Scottish Government

<b>Interventions suitable for</b>	Women aged 18 and over who have live criminal justice involvement in the last 12 months
<b>Programme Title and Provider</b>	<b>218 Project; Turning Point Scotland</b>
<b>Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available</b>	Female criminal justice service residential facility offering support for drug/alcohol use, offending behaviour, physical/ mental health, accommodation and social needs.
<b>Possible Outcomes</b>	To provide a safe environment in which women can address offending behaviour; tackle the underlying causes of offending behaviour; help women avert crises in their lives; and enable women to move on and reintegrate into society.
<b>Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention</b>	The assessment process has seven stages beginning with an initial assessment of the referral. Following this an appointment is made for a woman offender to attend the service to begin the assessment process. Once fully assessed a comprehensive, individually tailored care plan is created
