**BAIL SUPERVISION**

<b>Interventions suitable for</b>	Individuals at risk of remand
<b>Programme Title and Provider</b>	<b>Bail supervision</b>
<b>Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available</b>	Justice Social Work Bail Supervision service will be launched and available by June 2022. Staff have been recently recruited into post and are completing their induction into Court services, including the future provision of bail assessment and supervision.
<b>Possible Outcomes</b>	No remand, family connections, maintain employment, pro-social influences. Provides opportunity for increased Access to services and enhanced support. Early intervention for offence-focused work
<b>Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention</b>	In line with national guidance <a href="https://www.gov.scot/publications/national-guidance-bail-supervision/">https://www.gov.scot/publications/national-guidance-bail-supervision/</a>

**COMMUNITY PAYBACK ORDER: UNPAID WORK**

<b>Interventions suitable for</b>	Individuals at risk of custodial sentence
<b>Programme Title and Provider</b>	<b>Unpaid work</b>
<b>Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available</b>	There are local Unpaid Work Placements serving West Dunbartonshire. These placements include Environmental, Landscaping and Gardening Services. Placements include Knowetop Farm, Local Churches, Older Peoples Home, Schools, Charities and Community Gardens. Charities include: CHAS, Barnardo's, Salvation Army, Sue Ryder, DACA and Food share
<b>Possible Outcomes</b>	Outcomes for the community include a greater awareness of Community Justice, a greater degree of visibility for the public, increasing public confidence in Justice Services. The Community also benefit from improved local amenities with more attractive places to live encouraging area being used for legitimate purposes as the community have a pride in their area.  Outcomes for Service Users may include increased interpersonal skills, confidence in working in a variety of work placements with their peers and educators. Practical skills will be enhanced in preparation and support of joining mainstream employment.

<b>Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention</b>	Individuals are assessed via a Criminal Justice Social Work Report. Alternatively included by Sheriff at Level One at point of disposal from Court.
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**COMMUNITY PAYBACK ORDER: SUPERVISION**

<b>Interventions suitable for</b>	Individuals at risk of custodial sentence
<b>Programme Title and Provider</b>	<b>Supervision</b>
<b>Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available</b>	Supervision requirements include: Offence Focused Interventions on a 1-1 base to reduce the risk of re offending. Interventions are tailored to meet the specific needs of the service user, the nature of the offence and any learning needs identified by the LSCMi assessment.  Currently the one to one intervention is provided using a cognitive behavioral approach to enable service users to understand the cycle of their offending.
<b>Possible Outcomes</b>	Offence focused work can reduce the risk of re-offending, enabling individuals to promote pro-social behaviours/thinking and maintaining community integration.  It affords the Service User the opportunity to link in with relevant employment services, supporting reintegration into the work place.
<b>Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention</b>	Assessment is conducted as part of the Criminal Justice Social Work Report prepared for sentencing.

<b>Interventions suitable for</b>	Individuals with Mental Health diagnosis.
<b>Programme Title and Provider</b>	<b>Treatment: mental health</b>
<b>Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available</b>	Specific work/interventions would be assessed and delivered by the HSCP Community Mental Health Team.
<b>Possible Outcomes</b>	Support/treatment for mental health issues
<b>Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention</b>	The Justice Social Work Report may identify Mental Health diagnosis or concerns which would require further assessment. The author of the report may ask the sentencer to defer to allow a specific mental health assessment to be undertaken.

<b>Interventions suitable for</b>	Individuals with recognised Drug Addiction
<b>Programme Title and Provider</b>	<b>Treatment: drugs</b> <b>West Dunbartonshire Addiction Service</b> <b>Alternatives: Community Drug Service</b> <b>Turning Point Scotland: Near Fatal Overdose Project</b> <b>Residential Rehabilitation: Range of options for residential rehabilitation available through Third Sector Providers</b>
<b>Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available</b>	Service Users can be referred to both West Dunbartonshire Addiction Service, Alternatives Community Drug Service and Turning Point Scotland Near Fatal Overdose Project as appropriate.  Residential Rehabilitation: Spaces are sought on the basis on resources (financial) and availability.
<b>Possible Outcomes</b>	Support with problematic drug use using a person-centred approach.
<b>Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention</b>	As part of the Justice Social Work Report, drug issues will be assessed and potential resources identified. Can also be undertaken once CPO has been imposed and referral made by Supervising Officer.

**COMMUNITY PAYBACK ORDER: TREATMENT: ALCOHOL**

<b>Interventions suitable for</b>	Individuals with Alcohol
<b>Programme Title and Provider</b>	<b>Treatment: alcohol</b> <b>West Dunbartonshire Addiction Service</b> <b>Dumbarton Council on Alcohol (Third Sector)</b>
<b>Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available</b>	Service Users can be referred to both West Dunbartonshire Addiction Service and /or DACA.  Addiction Services will assist with prescribing of appropriate medication, referral for psychological assessment if appropriate and ongoing one to one supports.  DACA provides a counselling and group work service for those affected by alcohol.
<b>Possible Outcomes</b>	Support with problematic alcohol use using a person-centred approach.
<b>Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention</b>	As part of the Justice Social Work Report, issues with alcohol will be assessed and potential resources identified.  Referrals can also be made once a CPO has been imposed.

**DRUG TREATMENT AND TESTING ORDER (DTTO)**

<b>Interventions suitable for</b>	Individuals with long term drug addiction link to offending behaviours.
<b>Programme Title and Provider</b>	<b>Drug Treatment and Testing Order (DTTO)</b>
<b>Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available</b>	DTTO Provision available from Justice Social Work. This includes supervision and monitoring from both social work and nursing staff. Service Users are screened twice weekly and monthly reviews are submitted to Court.
<b>Possible Outcomes</b>	Reduction in long term addiction issues. Benefits to both the community in resultant reduction in negative behaviours.  Benefit to the individual with increase in prosocial behaviours and attitudes in their local community
<b>Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention</b>	DTTO Assessment via Justice Social Work request to Sentencers.

**STRUCTURED DEFERRED SENTENCE**

<b>Interventions suitable for</b>	Individuals assessed as suitable for inclusion with limited involvement in Justice system.
<b>Programme Title and Provider</b>	<b>Structured Deferred Sentence</b>
<b>Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available</b>	Justice Social Work Structured Deferred Sentence service will be launched and available by May 2022. Staff have been recently recruited into post and are completing their induction into Court services, including the future provision of bail assessment and supervision.
<b>Possible Outcomes</b>	<p>Opportunity for people to avoid being further embedded with the justice system.</p> <p>A community-based sentence can facilitate maintaining family connections, employment and pro-social influences. Provides opportunity for increased access to services and enhanced support. An intervention for offence-focused work</p>
<b>Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention</b>	As part of the assessment for disposal within a Justice Social Work Report.
<b>Where no specific scheme/intervention is available, is there capacity to provide a bespoke service based on judicial request? Please provide details</b>

<b>Interventions suitable for</b>	Residential Rehabilitation
<b>Programme Title and Provider</b>	<p><b>Jericho Society, abstinence-based rehabilitation for drugs and alcohol</b></p> <p><b>Phoenix Futures, medically assisted detox for drugs and alcohol</b></p>
<b>Details of all Specific national or local scheme/intervention(s) available</b>	Commissioned by West Dunbartonshire Alcohol and Drugs Partnership during 2020-2021 these options have become available due to ring-fenced national funding for residential rehabilitation.
<b>Possible Outcomes</b>	Reduction in problematic substance use and widened opportunities for improved quality of life.

<b>Process for Assessment and/or inclusion in scheme/intervention</b>	Through West Dunbartonshire Community Addiction Team. Access will be reliant on funding and spaces available.
<b>Relevant information re. funding for the programme</b>	National ring-fenced funding.
